1939-45 University of Sydney, MB BS, 2nd class Hons, John Wyeth Prize for Obstetrics, Shared Clayton Memorial Prize for Medicine & Clinical Medicine. Rowing Blue.

1942-44 AIF: Lieut in AASC Armoured Division – released to resume medical studies.

1946-49 Brasenose College, Oxford. Primary FRCS, Rowing Blue. Secretary Oxford University Boat Club. Represented Great Britain at 1948 Olympic Games in Men's Coxed Fours. Unexpectedly had to return to Australia. Assisted with his father's practice in Grafton; Assistant Pathologist Grafton Base Hospital Surgical Registrar, Launceston General Hospital, Tasmania.

1951 Qualified FRACS. Acting Superintendent, Launceston General Hospital.

1952 Cancer Institute of Victoria & Tasmania. Assistant Out-Patient surgeon, Prince Henry's Hospital, Melbourne.

1955 Shared award by Federal Council of BMA of the first Sir Henry Simpson Newland Prize in Surgery.

1956 Surgeon, Launceston General Hospital. Returned to UK to complete his FRCS.

1974-86 Surgeon, East Ham Memorial Hospital, London E7.
